We suggest that church groups work to arrange rides for campers from your church to and from camp (in vehicles suited for dirt roads).

Scholarships

Each summer, Cowboy's Rest offers a limited number of partial scholarships covering up to 50% of tuition for campers needing financial assistance.

Scholarship application forms can be downloaded from our website. The application should be filled out by a pastor, Sunday school teacher, or other Christian individual with knowledge of the camper.

Applications are due no later than two weeks prior to the start of camp.

All decisions to award scholarships are made by members of the Cowboy's Rest Board of Directors.

We also encourage your church to establish its own scholarship and fundraising programs.

REGISTRATION

1) REGISTRATION AS INDIVIDUALS

Campers can send their registration forms directly to Cowboy's Rest. Upon receiving the form and deposit, we will register that camper and email him or her an informational letter and medical release form. Our registrar will collect the balance of camp tuition as well as medical releases when the campers arrive at camp.

2) REGISTRATION AS CHURCH GROUPS

churches registering as groups are required to provide...

- **Counselors** for all campers (about 1 counselor for every 7 campers of the same gender)
- **Paperwork** for all campers and counselors (provided in group registration packet)
- **Transportation** to and from camp for all campers
- **Payment** for all campers in the form of a single check from your organization.

Group Registration Rates:

\$260 per camper (5-day camp), \$315 per camper (6-day camp)

TIPS FOR CHURCH GROUPS

- Distribute flyers and information to the students (especially our camper info form)
- Encourage and remind students to register (if doing so as individuals)
- Answer questions and assist with registration and scholarship forms.
- Keep track of the number of campers planning to attend from your church.
- Arrange transportation for campers from your church
- Ensuring that all campers have their signed Medical Release Forms before embarking for camp
- Collect and label medications from campers before they embark for camp to give to the camp nurse.



GUEST COUNSELORS

If your church is registering as a group, all counselors must....
Submit a Volunteer Application (available online) at least a week
before attending camp. Volunteer Counselors must read our
Counselor Handbook (available online), sign the Agreement form,
and complete a staff medical form and bring it to camp.

Packing List
